VENDORS COMMENTS:

We bought Cobalt in 2010, having sold our previous wooden yacht, Willy Bolton. We had sailed from UK and planned to continue our offshore cruising. Cobalt needed some work, and when we sailed it back to Nelson, we hauled out in Haven Boatyard. On the trip from Auckland we discovered fuel problems, so Haven Boatyard cleaned out the keel diesel tank.

Cobalt was then completely redecked. The mast was craned off and the in-mast reefing dismantled and checked. All the standing rigging was renewed. A Mase 3.5KVA diesel generator and calorifier hot water system were installed. Two new electric Jabsco toilets and holding tanks were fitted. The boat was then brought up to CAT 1 standard with a new liferaft and drogue. In Opua we had a complete set of new sails made by Ross Harold.

Since 2011 we have sailed most winters up to the Pacific islands, especially Vanuatu, Fiji and New Caledonia. We have continued to upgrade Cobalt. In 2011 Dicksons Boatyard, Nelson, removed what we considered a poorly made scoop on the stern and restored the boat to Warwick's original design. We had a custom built stainless steel and wooden swimming platform added in its place. The hull was professionally resprayed.

In 2016, Norsands boatyard in Whangarei blasted the keel and scraped all the antifoul off, primed the steelwork and antifouled the hull. A new gear box was also fitted.

The following year, in Gulf Harbour, the engine was removed and completely reconditioned by Moon Engines, with new parts where necessary: mounts, exhaust manifold, injector pump and oil cooler amongst others.

Other upgrades during our ownership:

New steering rams and complete service of the hydraulic pumps.

New electric motor for the inmast furler.

Two solar panels

A new 100 litre diesel day tank

Open Ocean water maker fitted

A new 2.9m Highfield aluminium lightweight dinghy and 3.3 HP Mercury outboard.

Over the last couple of years we have successfully cruised Vanuatu, PNG, Indonesia and Australia, and have returned to Nelson, our home port. During our voyages over the last decade we have successfully sailed with just the two of us. Although Cobalt is a large yacht, we have never felt the need for crew. We have found her a perfect liveaboard boat, with plenty of room for family and friends to visit. Her high head room and many opening windows and hatches make her a comfortable, light, cool and well ventilated home, especially in the Tropics.
